

Introduction:

As a Vocationally Related Qualification (VRQ) – Level 4 is made up of five Units comprising of 37 Learning Outcomes. Each Unit will be ‘taught’ in a classroom environment.

Target audience:

The prime audience for this course is individuals working in the waste management industry, who may or may not be graduates, but nevertheless wish to enhance their knowledge and understanding of sustainable waste management and advanced technologies.

Aims:

- To achieve a Higher Level Award, Level 4 in Waste Treatment Technologies.
- To provide an overview of the UK planning and licensing/permitting systems and introduce the environmental reporting requirements for the operation of waste management facilities.

Course content:

The course consists of a taught section, and then a work or theory based project. Each learning outcome will be assessed both individually (Unit by Unit) and collectively; within the final assignment. An overview of the five mandatory Units is provided in our Award Overview. The learning objectives and further details of the curriculum topics can be supplied on request or visit our website.

Successful completion of the VRQ will be achieved when the candidate attains the minimum of 70% pass mark for each Unit’s test paper and achieve a Pass for the Assignment.

Teaching and Assessment Methods

The course is run over 4 days with sessions beginning at 0900 prompt and will conclude at approximately 1530 hours. Outside of these times delegates will be involved in formally answering questions on the subjects discussed - as well as tutorial and group discussion time. It is recommended that delegates stay overnight at the venue location prior to and on each day of the course. This is a very intensive study course assigned a level 4 status.
